TEPEZZA

FDA approval date: 21 January 2020

Active Ingredient: Teprotumumab-trbw

Strength: nitiate dosing with 10 mg/kg for first infusion, followed by 20 mg/kg

every 3 weeks for 7 additional infusions.

Dosage form : Parentral

Route of administration: Intravenous infusion

Mechanism of action: Teprotumumab-trbw's mechanism of action in patients with Thyroid Eye Disease has not been fully characterized. Teprotumumab-trbw binds to IGF-1R and blocks its activation and signaling.

Adverse drug reaction : Most common adverse reactions (incidence greater than 5%) are muscle spasm, nausea, alopecia, diarrhea, fatigue, hyperglycemia, hearing impairment, dry skin, dysgeusia and headache
